

How was the marine mammal item/part obtained:

<u>Pikimairawea</u> - Matau, cannot remember the source of the bone as its a small piece from a much larger stash of bone that I've collected since 1983 when i started carving at Maraeroa carving school,

at that time i was coming into contact with whalebone and teeth that was up to 70 years old, from a couple of the old whaling families in Picton . Thewhale tooth material that the barb is made from is from a whale stranded in Te Whanau a Apanui rohe in the early 60s, I received a box of them from an elderly Tuho man in the late 1990s that he had saved from that large bull sperm whale

Aumakua - Maripi, this bone is from the large Gisborne Sperm Stranding (in the early 80s i think). the Ngutukao teeth were given to me in the 90s.

Rei Niho, this sperm whale tooth is from a Stranding in Wairarapa in the late 1990 early 2000s at Nga Rā o Kupe, where someone cut the teeth out of a large whale, Doc and Police along with Representatives of the Local Iwi led by Haami Te Whaiti managed to recover most of them from the person responsible, after making 17 taong for gifts at the completion of their Waitangi claim, they gifted me a range of niho. this niho is made from one of those teeth gifted in that pack.

4 <u>Hoeroa</u> - this Hoeroa was made from a Sperm jawbone that was gifted to me by Te Miringa Hohaia and Rangiroa Rongonui in 1994 from a Sperm whale that had been buried many years before from a stranding at Opunake.
