

There are waterfalls in the reserve and it has a SSWI ranking of 'Moderate' (Rasch 1989).


There are reputedly historic hut sites and historic roads in the reserve.

Recreational opportunities include: hunting and walking.

Pests include: possums, pigs, goats. Other threats include future pine logging in adjacent areas and fire.

Lowland to sub-alpine podocarp tawa/hard beech forest (miro, rimu, red and silver beech, sub-alpine species). 'High' botanical conservation value (Shaw 1988).

Fauna include forest birds such as whitehead, kereru and weka. Bats are also present. SSWI ranking 'Moderate-High (Rasch 1989).

The reserve includes Mount Aorangiwai, which is 1276m above sea level. There are Maori legends concerning Aorangiwai, and it has strong cultural associations for Ngati Porou.

Recreational opportunities include: hunting (pig, deer), climbing.



NATURAL AND HISTORIC VALUES

Semi-coastal kahikatea/puriri-tawa-pukatea, kohekohe forest; titoki-mahoe-kohekohe-mixed broadleaved forest; *Carex geminata*, convolvulus, grasses, sedgeland. 'Exceptional' botanical conservation value. Unique forest association, the only known area remaining (Beadel 1989). Highest ranked Protected Natural Area in the Turanga Ecological District (Clarkson). Remnant of an historic landscape in an otherwise pastoral setting.

Fauna include: common bush birds. SSWI ranking 'Moderate' forest (Rasch 1989).

High recreational usage for forest appreciation, short walks, birdwatching and educational purposes. There are interpretive signs in the reserve.



NATURAL AND HISTORIC VALUES

Rotoroa and Rotongaio lakebeds. 300-400m above sea level, consisting of sand, mud and pumice, fed by springs and tributaries, depth 5-19m. Lake margins have a raupo reedland, including the vulnerably ranked swamp buttercup *Ranunculus macropus*. 'Moderate-High' botanical significance (Beadel 1989). Fauna probably include: dabchick, spotless crake, scaup, bittern. Rotongaio is particularly rich in nutrients but still provides a good habitat for waterfowl. Native fish species are present in both lakes (bullies, eels). Small numbers of trout are also present in both lakes (Shaw 1985). 'Moderate-High' SSWI ranking (Rasch 1989). There is a pa site (W19/127) near the edge of L. Rotongaio, and the area has high cultural significance as a traditional eeling area. There are Te Kooti era burials in the vicinity (Lambert 1977:311-313).

THREATS TO NATURAL AND HISTORIC VALUES


Pests include: domestic stock, possums, geese, thistles. Other threats include: excessive levels of nutrients in the lake water (encouraging vegetation growth).

MANAGEMENT

Management Objectives: Primarily General Ecosystems Management (s.3.3.12 refers), General Species (s.3.3.20 refers), Threatened Species (s.3.3.21 refers) and Culturally Significant Species (s.3.3.28 refers). Shrubland composed of kanuka/manuka with mingimingi, olearia, ti ngahere and tauhinu. There is a wetland on the Waipare Plateau with raupo, harakeke, toetoe, manuka and kiokio. The area is the only intact wetland surrounded by an indigenous forest catchment in the Waiau Ecological District. The reserve contains the endangered plant kowhai ngutukaka (*Clianthus punicius*, otherwise known as 'kaka beak') (Beadel 1988).

Fauna include bush birds such as weka, kereru, pied tit and whitehead, with falcon and possible kiwi. it is possible the 'giant gecko' (kawakaweau) is also present in the reserve.

There is a recorded historic pit site (Z16/159) and other possible unrecorded sites. The area is culturally significant ti Ngati Whakara. Recreational opportunities include hunting.


