Tēnā koe

Thank you for your Official Information Act request to the Department of Conservation, received on 19 January 2021 in which you asked for:

- 1. I am seeking information (documents/reports/briefings and correspondence) written, sent or received since Jan 1st 2020, relating to a review, and the pausing or cessation of the predator control portion of the Sub-Antarctic Islands Programme.
- 2. All documents/reports/briefings and correspondence, written, sent or received since Jan 1st 2020, relating to funding

On 4th February 2021 you clarified (or refined) your request to:

1. I am seeking all: reports, reviews, advice, minutes, memos and updates written, sent or received regarding the decision-making rationale, financial rationale and ecological impacts of pausing the predator control work in the subantarctic, since January 2020.

After the successful eradication of mice from the subantarctic Antipodes Island, the Department was buoyed to continue with investigation into the feasibility of eradication of mice, cats and pigs from Maukahuka/Auckland Island, and the Pest Free Maukahuka/Auckland Island project commenced. Initially, the project was funded through Budget 2018, and subsequently through the International Visitor Levy (IVL) fund which utilised levies paid by international tourists to Aotearoa New Zealand. Due to the significance in size and logistical challenges in accessing Maukahuka/Auckland Island, initial estimates of cost of the eradication were placed at over \$80 million. The decision to pause the Maukahuka Auckland Island Eradication Project was made by the Director-General Lou Sanson in March 2020, during a time when the Department (and wider government) were preparing for the highly likely austerity measures due to the Covid-19 pandemic, particularly with the IVL funding disappearing virtually overnight with the closure of borders to international visitors.



This was not a cessation of all work however, as the team has continued to finalise reports into the investigation of eradication of mice, cats and pigs from Maukahuka. The team has effectively finalised 'design' of the eradication project.

Concurrently, the Director-General asked for a process to help the Department understand and prioritise investment in large landscape scale projects, essentially creating an optimised package of landscape scale sites for investment, and a process for helping rationalise where to focus future investment. The Optimised Landscape Investment Portfolio was developed through significant work and internal consultation in April and May 2020. It uses a phased and gated process (scope, design, implement, sustain), to ensure distinction in decision points for delivery of a project. Maukahuka Auckland Island sits amongst this portfolio, and due to the thorough work of the Pest-Free Auckland Island team, is ready to "implement" when funding / funding partners are obtained.
