Thank you for your request to the Department of Conservation, received on 11 March 2021. Due to the nature of the request this has been considered under the Official Information Act and Privacy Act. You requested:

- 1. ...a list of existing Kaimahi for Nature projects (NZ wide) that have received funding, as well as their contact people? We are keen to compile a list of opportunities for unemployed tourism staff to join Kaimahi for Nature.
- 2. Is there any funding remaining? If so, could you provide a detailed process for applying for funding?

Thank you for your participation in the Government's Jobs for Nature programme. As you know this is a multi-agency approach that will see the investment of \$1.245 billion and the creation of 11,000 nature-based jobs over a four-year period.

DOC's Kaimahi for Nature \$200 million fund aims to bring councils, iwi and local businesses together to provide nature-based jobs both on and off public land, through regional partnership groups. Projects are targeted towards helping businesses maintain their workforce and do conservation work as we move towards economic recovery. Where projects have not identified a workforce, support is available from the Ministry of Social Development (MSD) to help find employees to fill available roles.

As at 19 March 2021, the list of Kaimahi for Nature funded projects with signed funding agreements can be found in Appendix 1. Where the project will be employing people directly, the project lead has provided their contact details.

2. Is there any funding remaining? If so, could you provide a detailed process for applying for funding?

As of 9 April, the Kaimahi for Nature \$200 million fund has received over 110 project applications which are expected to oversubscribe Kaimahi for Nature funds. As the fund is close to being fully allocated, we are not actively seeking further projects. However, there may be opportunity in the future to apply for funding and will be in touch with you to discuss this opportunity.

We are forecasting all of DOC's Jobs for Nature \$501.1 million funding to be committed by the end of June 2021.
