
There are about 26 bottlenose dolphins visiting in the Bay of Islands

They stick quite close to the shore where they love to eat fish and squid. Babies (called calves) are born in spring and summer. They feed on mainly milk from their mothers for two to three years and stay close to mum until they are 6 six years old.

Bottlenose dolphins travel in groups called pods and talk to each other by squeaking and whistling. They can hold their breath for two or three minutes before coming up to the surface to breathe.


There are also around 33 other species of marine mammals who visit the bay, to feed, nurse and play. The Bay of Islands provides a diverse range of ecosystems for these marine mammals, and we can help make it safer for them.


