Current Opportunities

Gordon Park Scenic Reserve

- Gordon Park is a small reserve that is a precious sample of lowland forest one of the last remaining in this area, just 5 minutes from Whanganui East.
- DOC and volunteers meet on the second Tuesday of each month from 9am-12 noon and fourth Thursday of each month from 1pm-4pm.
- Tasks include weed control, planting, checking pest traps and periodic monitoring of plant and bird species.
