My wife Alison and I are collectors. Over the years we have collected a wide variety of interesting antique or vintage NZ items – old NZ maps, old china, early kauri furniture, early colonial housewares, mining, timber and gold industry paraphernalia etc, along with items relating to whaling. We have loosely described these small collections of different colonial items as our “private museum”. We kept these in our basement and over the years and it has given us great pleasure to show the displayed items to invited friends. We have never advertised our collections nor been open to the public.

We are now 77 and 76 years old and are in the process of downsizing prior to selling our house and moving into smaller accommodation. To this end we have been selling material through Cordy’s Auctions. For the last 8 weeks or so we have had items in almost all of Cordy’s auctions. The auction on 28th May 2019 featured the disposal of our whaling collection (try pot, harpoons, lances, baleen cutters, flensing knives etc, and a few whale bones). After concern was expressed about selling whalebones, in consultation with Andrew at Cordy’s, we withdrew lots 218 – 224. Until then we were not aware of the requirements of the Marine Mammals Protection Act of 1978. None of these bones was found on the beach by us. We did not cut them off stranded whales. They were all purchased some time ago from antique fairs, reputable antique dealers or from TradeMe. Visual examination of the bones shows that all are very old. The bones are worn and fractured and could not be used for carving or making ornaments. The origin of the bones is unknown as no one from whom we purchased them gave us any information about their history. We have no way of knowing which iwi would need to be consulted in the process of obtaining a permit.

We are applying for a permit to hold the bones until they can be sold to another collector.
