

Application for the import, export, and re-export of **LIVE ANIMALS** subject
to the Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989

1. **Use this form for live animals only.** Please use different forms for personal or household effects, or commercial and scientific/zoo trade of non-live animals, plants, and specimen lot applications.
2. Only complete and legible forms will be processed. Please allow 20 working days.
3. Many wildlife items may require approval under other DOC administered legislation. In particular:
 - exports of any bird, reptile, amphibian or bat, or parts of such species (Wildlife Act 1953: contact permissionshamilton@doc.govt.nz)
 - marine mammals such as dolphins, seals and whales (Marine Mammals Protection Act 1978: contact permissionschristchurch@doc.govt.nz)
4. There are also Ministry for Primary Industries regulations governing the import and export of some plant and animal items. Please contact MPI (www.mpi.govt.nz) for further information.
5. After you submit your application, a CITES officer will contact you to provide details on how to pay the application fee. Payment must be made within 7 working days, otherwise the application will not be progressed. CITES officers may also request any other information necessary to support your application.
6. Please note CITES permits are only valid for one consignment up to six months from the date of issue.
7. Once your application is approved and your permit/certificate is sent to you the original CITES documentation must accompany the items on export/import. For more information please see www.doc.govt.nz/cites

1. Open the form in Adobe Acrobat
2. Click the **Tools** menu in the top left
3. Open **Fill & Sign**
4. Click in a text field and begin typing. For fields with multiple lines (e.g. addresses) use 'Enter' to move to the next line underneath.

Export and re-export permits must be validated upon departure from New Zealand by the NZ Customs Service.

If the permit is not validated, your specimen(s) may be confiscated upon entry into the destination country. If this happens, DOC has no recourse to secure the release of the specimen(s).
