Mō te tūranga | About the role

As an Amenities Ranger, Wānaka (Central Otago district-based) within the Heritage and Visitor work group supporting the maintenance and operation of visitor facilities across the Central Otago District. The role focuses on maintaining campsites, huts, and recreation infrastructure, ensuring high standards of visitor experience, safety, and compliance. You will work both independently and as part of a wider team across a diverse and often remote landscape.

Key Tasks

- Clean campsites, huts, and amenity facilities daily
- Undertake track maintenance including gravelling and vegetation clearance
- Carry out routine hut maintenance (including Brewster Hut and Gillespie Circuit huts)
- Complete compliance checks at huts and campsites
- Provide visitor safety information, including weather updates
- Carry out compliance activities as required
- Manage and monitor water, sewerage, and solar systems
- Complete work reports and timesheets using mobile applications
- Biodiversity; tracking tunnels, trapping, monitoring

Ngā pūkenga me ngā wheako | Skills and experience

- Strong communication skills and ability to engage with a wide range of people
- Experience in recreation facility or amenity maintenance (e.g. cleaning, mowing, weed control, basic repairs)
- High level of physical fitness for demanding outdoor work
- Ability to work independently and as part of a small team
- Good organisational skills and ability to manage tasks effectively
- Basic knowledge of conservation and New Zealand's natural and cultural heritage

- Ability to use mobile technology for reporting and operational tasks
- Sound decision-making skills, including in emergency situations
- Current First Aid certificate
- Full New Zealand driver's licence

- Experience working around boats or helicopters
- Experience using scrub bars, hedge trimmers, or similar equipment
