The Court of Appeal and Supreme Court judgments in the *PauaMAC5 Inc.* case had ramifications for the types of authorisations delegates of the Director-Central of Conservation (DG) can grant under section 53 of the Wildlife Act 1953:

- 1. An application for **authorisation under section 53 critically be considered if the activity is "catch alive" or "kill".** Lesser interferences such as disturbance or unsuccessful pursuit can only be authorised if they occur as part of "catch alive or kill".
- 2. Authorising "catch alive or kill" envisages something **inherently intentional**. It cannot be used to facilitate or "cover" in case of an accidental action. An example of accidental killing is hitting a bird with your car. Lasidontal killing would be where an area is bulldozed knowing lizards will be present even though salvage has been undertaken. Accidental cannot be authorised; incidental can.
- 3. The judgments **also confirmed the purpose of the Act** (essentially to protect wildlife and control game). This means that an activity authorised under section 53 must promote the wider purpose of the Act. Purely anthropocentric activities with no benefit to wildlife would be unified to meet the purpose of the Act as there is no element of protection.







Purely anthropocentric activities with no benefit to wildlife would be unlikely to meet the purpose of the Act as there is no element of protection.


