Thank you for your Official Information Act (OIA) request to the Department of Conservation, received on 02 August 2022 in which you asked for:

"With respect, the latest Canterbury Aoraki Conservation Board public papers for August's meeting refers to an Amuri irrigation permission, that was referred to the board, and approved. Can DoC please provide copies of the application, an assessment of environmental effects (if one exists), the conservation board's advice, and the decision maker's approval report?"

On 4 August 2022 we transferred your request in full under section 14 of the OIA to the Canterbury Aoraki Conservation Board. This was subsequently transferred back to us on 11 August 2022. We apologise for any confusion this may have caused, and note that we have since continued to operate on the timeframe of receiving your request on 2 August 2022.

On 26 August 2022 we extended your request until 13 September 2022 due to consultations required to make a decision on your request.

We subsequently sent you a decision letter on 13 September 2022 noting that we required further time to prepare our response for release.

## Our response

On 1 February 2022 a decision was made by us to grant a concession to Amuri Irrigation Company Limited. A summary of the decision can be viewed on pages 65-67 in the attached Decision Support Document (DSD).

The information in scope of your request is listed in the table below and attached to this letter.
