Thank you for your request to the Department of Conservation, received on 18 December 2023, in which you asked for a copy of the lease agreement between the Department of Conservation and Kah NZ Limited along with information relating to any legal dispute including correspondence between the parties.

We have considered your request under the Official Information Act 1982.

Your questions and our responses are listed below:

 A copy of the lease agreement entered into between the Department of Conservation and the lessee of Chateau Tongariro (who is understand to be 'Kah New Zealand Limited' – but please correct me if I am wrong);

The requested agreement is a registered lease and is publicly available via Land Information New Zealand. 2. A brief summary of any dispute or agreement between DOC and the lessee regarding the lessee's obligation to return the building in good repair and condition

End of lease negotiations with the previous leaseholders are ongoing. Due to the nature of these negotiations (which are subject to legal privilege) we are unable to provide further comment.

3. Any correspondence between DOC and the lessee (or either parties' lawyers) regarding the issue of the repair and condition of the building.

Correspondence material sought consists of advice subject to legal privilege. Subsequently, this aspect of your request is refused in full via section 18(a) of the Official Information Act by virtue of having grounds to withhold under section 9(2)(h) to maintain legal professional privilege.
