Thank you for your Official Information Act request to the Department of Conservation, received on 17 February 2025, in which you asked:

All communications regarding Charlie Girl for the past year.

Several further questions were transferred to the Dunedin City Council on 24 February 2025.

Your questions and my responses are as follows:

This part of your request is therefore partially refused under section 18(d) of the Official Information Act 1982 as the information for the period to 27 June 2024 is publicly available.



In our email of 19 February, we also asked you to consider refining your request for all communications regarding Charlie. To provide you with this information from 28 June 2024 onwards would involve substantial collation and research. As we have not heard from you, I regret that I must refuse your request for all correspondence from 28 June 2024 onwards under section 18(f) of the Official Information Act. The information cannot be made available without substantial collation and research.

You are entitled to seek an investigation and review of my decision by writing to an Ombudsman as provided by section 28(3) of the Official Information Act.
