



Non-CITES Declaration

This is to certify that the following species, commonly exported from New Zealand, are not listed on the Appendices of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES).

<i>Wallabia bicolor</i>	Swamp Wallaby
<i>Oryctolagus cuniculus cuniculus</i>	European Rabbit
<i>Bubalus bubalis</i>	Water Buffalo
<i>Lepus europaeus occidentalis</i>	Brown Hare

In New Zealand, the above-named animals are introduced species, not native fauna. They are not species threatened with extinction by international trade.

Under New Zealand's Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989, no documentation is required to export any farmed or hunted trophies, meat, skin, antlers, or fur (all parts and derivatives) from the above-named species.

I confirm that the following species are not present in New Zealand: *Cervus elaphus hanglu*; *Cervus elaphus barbarus*; *Cervus elaphus bactrianus*; *Dama dama mesopotamica*; *Capra hircus aegragus*; *Odocoileus virginianus mayensis*; *Lagorcheses hirsutus*; *Lagostrophus fasciatus*; and *Onychogalea fraenata*.
