



Non-CITES Declaration

This is to certify that the following species commonly exported from New Zealand, are not listed on the Appendices of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES).

<i>Wallabia bicolor</i>	Swamp wallaby
<i>Oryctolagus cuniculus cuniculus</i>	European rabbit
<i>Lepus europaeus occidentalis</i>	Brown hare

In New Zealand the above-mentioned animals are introduced species, not native fauna. They are not species threatened with extinction by international trade.

No documentation is required under New Zealand's Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989 to export any farmed or hunted trophies, meat, skins, antlers, fur (and all parts and derivatives), from the species listed above.

I can confirm that the species *Cervus elaphus hanglu*, *Cervus elaphus barbarus*, *Cervus elaphus bactrianus*, *Dama dama mesopotamica*, *Capra hircus aegagrus*, *Odocoileus virginianus mayensis*, *Lagorchestes hirsutus*, *Lagostrophus fasciatus* and *Onychogalea fraenata* are not present in New Zealand.
