



There are about **26** bottlenose dolphins visiting in the Bay of Islands

They stick quite close to the shore where they love to eat fish and squid. Babies (called calves) are born in spring and summer. They feed on mainly milk from their mothers for two to three years and stay close to mum until they are 6 six years old.

Bottlenose dolphins travel in groups called pods and talk to each other by squeaking and whistling. They can hold their breath for two or three minutes before coming up to the surface to breathe.

There are also around **33** other species of marine mammals who visit the bay, to feed, nurse and play. The Bay of Islands provides a diverse range of ecosystems for these marine mammals, and we can help make it safer for them.

Too many boats near marine mammals can stop them resting and feeding. It can be stressful for them - especially for mums looking after their young. We can help keep marine mammals safe by scanning for fins, staying away and when boating stopping.
