



All luggage and gear must go through the quarantine shed on arrival.

Getting there

Tūhua is privately owned and is administered by the Tūhua Trust Board on behalf of its beneficiaries. Landing on the island is only permitted at South-East Bay. Visitors are welcome by prior arrangement and are asked to follow a few rules and biosecurity precautions.

Before you pack - think biosecurity

You must complete the Tūhua Visitor Checklist before you depart, and take it with you. A checklist will be sent to you for each member of your party; please contact Tuhua Trust Board if you require further copies.

Show your completed checklists to the island kaitiaki when you arrive.

You must prevent any pest plants and animals from reaching this pest-free island. They are a big risk.

Rodents and other mammals, weed seeds or small insects may hitch a ride with you. It is your responsibility to make sure they don't.

When you get there

Before unloading your boat, report immediately to the island caretaker / kaitiaki.

You must show the kaitiaki your completed checklist(s).

You will check all your luggage again in the quarantine shed on the island. This is the last line of defence.

How to pack your gear:

1. Use the checklist as you pack your gear.

2. Protect packed gear from pests getting in.

3. Take your checklist with you on the boat.

4. Hand the completed checklist to kaitiaki on island.

5. Check your gear again in the quarantine shed.
